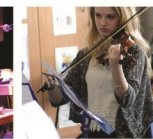
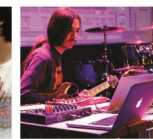
Help UK Air Ambulance Services by recycling your Used Postage Stamps!!!

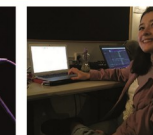
